Semester end feedback by trainee teachers of 2023-24 academic year on 3rd semester syllabus of 2 year B.Ed. program of University of Mysore

Trainee teachers studying in 3rd Semester B.Ed. were selected to give their opinion about the present 3rd semester syllabus which is prescribed by the University of Mysore. About 68 trainee teachers out of 85 gave their opinion about the syllabus which they have studied during 2023-24 academic year.

- Majority of the trainee teachers (> 95 %) have expressed that the course is relevant to the requirements of the future teachers.
- About 58 respondents out of 68 have agreed that the syllabus is not only relevant to meet the needs of the trainee teachers but also flexible in nature to satisfy the demands of would be teachers. Also, almost same number of trainee teachers have expressed their views that the present curriculum supports them to get adequate co-curricular learning experiences and said that the Program Learning Outcomes and Course Learning Outcomes have been informed to them at the start of the B.Ed. program
- About 18 trainee teachers opined that some of the topics are overlapping with the previously taught course and 22 trainee teachers have reacted no to this.
- Approximately 50 % the trainee teachers studying in 3rd semester have expressed their feeling of adding new courses or topics to the existing syllabus as courses are overlapping with the previously taught courses, meaning to say that, a thorough revision of the syllabus is required.
- About 28 trainee teachers out of 68 (approximately 40 %) have said that the courses prescribed in the four consecutive semesters need to be reordered or restructured in an orderly fashion so that trainee teachers could get the information in a systematic manner or order.
- About 9 (13 %) of the trainee teachers have said that the number of hours allocated to the course are not adequate, whereas around 80 % of trainee teachers have said no to this.
- 95 % of the trainee teachers have agreed that the faculty members use different pedagogies such as presentations, discussion, cooperative learning technique, field visits, projects, etc. for the effective transaction of the curriculum.
- More than 80 % of the trainee teachers studying in 3rd semester are satisfied with the internal evaluation of the faculty members.

To conclude, although, more than 95 % of the trainee teachers have expressed that the course is relevant to the requirements of the future teachers, and about 85 % have agreed that the syllabus is not only relevant to meet the needs of the trainee teachers but also flexible in nature so that the demands of would be teachers could be satisfied, and have expressed that the present curriculum supports them to get adequate co-curricular learning experiences, about 40 to 50 percent of the trainee teachers have uncovered their opinion to reorder and restructure the syllabus to avoid the repetitions or overlapping of the information.

Semester end feedback by trainee teachers of 2023-24 academic year on 1st semester syllabus of 2 year B.Ed. program

Trainee teachers studying in 1st Semester B.Ed. were selected to give their opinion about the present 1st semester syllabus of 2 year B.Ed. program. About 79 trainee teachers out of 99 gave their opinion about the syllabus which they have studied during 2023-24 academic year.

- It was also found from the study that the major portion of the sample of the trainee teachers (approximately 65 %) have expressed that the course is relevant to the requirements of the future teachers. They have also opined that the syllabus is not only relevant to meet the needs of the trainee teachers but also flexible in nature to satisfy the demands of would be teachers. The present curriculum supports them to get adequate co-curricular learning experiences and said that the Program Learning Outcomes and Course Learning Outcomes have been informed to them at the start of the B.Ed. program.
- About 28 trainee teachers opined that some of the topics are overlapping with the previously taught course and 27 trainee teachers have reacted no to this.
- Approximately 30 % the trainee teachers studying in 1st semester have expressed their feeling of adding new courses or topics to the existing syllabus as courses are overlapping with the previously taught courses, meaning to say that, a thorough revision of the syllabus is required.
- About 56 % of the respondents have felt that the number of hours allocated to the courses in 1st semester are adequate, whereas around 10.1 % of trainee teachers have said no to this.
- 65 % of the trainee teachers have agreed that the faculty members use different pedagogies such as presentations, discussion, cooperative learning technique, field visits, projects, etc. for the effective transaction of the curriculum. About 50 % of the trainee teachers studying in 1st semester are satisfied with the internal evaluation of the faculty members.

To conclude, 65 % of the trainee teachers studying in 1st semester have expressed that the course is relevant to the requirements of the future teachers, and have agreed that the syllabus is not only relevant to meet the needs of the trainee teachers but also flexible in nature so that the demands of would be teachers could be satisfied, and have expressed that the present curriculum supports them to get adequate co-curricular learning experiences, about 30 percent of the trainee teachers have uncovered their opinion to add new topics and/or courses to the existing syllabus to avoid overlapping of the information.













From the data obtained, it is revealed that about the books prescribed in the curriculum are satisfactory. The curriculum needs to be reviewed as 26% and 72% of the teachers have strongly agreed and agreed respectively. Current syllabus is need based and academically flexible. The present curriculum content is relevant and almost fulfils the needs of student teachers. Also, the existing B.Ed. curriculum carries sufficient number of optional papers and the syllabus reflects the proper balance between theory and practical. The curriculum is also relevant to the present educational system and enhances employability. But care must be taken for component 10 as 2% of the teachers have shown negative opinion in this regard.

From the above result, it is revealed that the 56% of the teachers strongly agreed and 44% of the teachers have agreed that Curriculum review is needed hence the present curriculum has to review accordingly.

From the above result, it is evident that 88% of the teachers agreed that the current syllabus need based and 11% of the teachers have dis agreed that the current syllabus is not need based. Hence once again the curriculum need to be reviewed regarding the syllabus need based.

From the above result, it is revealed that the 22% of the teachers strongly agreed and 77% of the teachers have agreed that the Curriculum has good academic flexibility. So we can say that the present curriculum has good academic flexibility.

From the above result, it is revealed that the 55% of the teachers have strongly agreed and 22% of the teachers have agreed that the course content fulfils the needs of the student teachers. Overall 77% of the teachers have agreed that the syllabus course content fulfils the need of the student teachers. Whereas 22% of the teachers dis agreed that the syllabus course content not fulfils the need of the student teachers. So while preparing the syllabus proper care should be taken which fulfils the need of the student teachers.

From the above result, it is revealed that the 11% of the teachers have strongly agreed and 88% of the teachers have agreed that Programme outcome of the syllabus is well defined.


From the above result, it is revealed that the 33% of the teachers have strongly agreed and 33% of the teachers have agreed that the programme of studies carries sufficient number of optional papers. From the above result, it is revealed that the 44% of the teachers have strongly agreed and 22% of the teachers have agreed that the Curriculum is relevant to present educational system. Whereas 33% of the teachers have dis agreed that the Curriculum is not relevant to present educational system. Hence, while designing Curriculum proper care should be taken that the curriculum needs to be relevant to the present educational system.

From the above result, it is revealed that the 33% of the teachers have strongly agreed and 22% of the teachers have agreed that the Curriculum enhance employability. Whereas 22% of the teachers have undecided and 11% of the teachers have dis agreed and 11% have strongly dis agreed that the curriculum does not enhance employability. 44% in total have undecided including strongly dis agree that the present curriculum is not enhance employability. Hence while preparing the curriculum proper care should be taken to enhance employability among student teachers.
